

World Premiere Comic Musical Leads Ross Valley Players New Works Festival

For a Three Week Run March 21 – April 6, 2025

ROSS, CA (February 15, 2025) – On March 21, Ross Valley Players makes good on its decades-long, historic commitment to living Bay Area playwrights with a light-hearted spoof that shows the snags of embracing technology over tenderness. "Pet Lingerie" is a musical about "love, dreams, and really bad crowdfunding ideas."

Co-writers Fred Raker and Bruce Tallerman met in Hollywood, writing for television, before decamping to Northern California and new chapters in their literary lives.

Fred Raker began his career doing stand-up comedy in New York alongside Jerry Seinfeld and Paul Reiser. He moved to Hollywood where he became a staff writer on several network television shows, including ABC's "Fridays" (featuring Larry David and Michael Richards). In San Francisco, Fred's solo show, "It Could Have Been a Wonderful Life," a Jewish take on the Jimmy Stewart movie became a Hanukkah classic.

Bruce Tallerman's credits include a Showtime-TV series and several TV pilots. He is a published fiction writer, with short stories appearing in small-press literary magazines. Bruce has performed his original songs in New York's Greenwich Village and is currently performing in various Central Coast venues.

Director/Choreographer Gary Stanford, Jr. is familiar to North Bay audiences not only for his acting, but also his directing. Gary likens *Pet Lingerie* to one of his favorite films, the satirical *Best in Show*, and says, "I don't take lightly the shows I work on and this spoke to me as a hilarious adventure."

The acting ensemble includes: Natalie Buck-Bauer, AnneJelika Ong Cortez, Laszlo Horner, Landers Markwick, Vicki Victoria, Dan Schwager, Robin Schild, and Ron Talbot with Suzanne Carroll and Adonis Reyes as understudies. Kevin X. Dong, Wesley Booth, and Thinh Nguyen are the musicians.

In addition to Direction by Gary Stanford, Jr., RVP's creative team includes Musical Direction, Kevin X. Dong: Set Design and Master Builder, Michael Walraven; Lighting Design, Michele Samuels; Sound Design, Billie Cox; Costume Design, Valera Coble; Properties Design and Scenic Painter, Dhyanis Carniglia; Projections Design, Zach Norris, Intimacy Choreographer, Heather Ondersma, Stage Manager, Dianne Harrison; Assistant Stage Manager, Adonis Reyes; and Co-Producers, Jay Manley (Production) and Lynn Lohr (Publicity).

The New Works Festival continues with Sunday night readings March 23 and March 30 at 7pm with scripts by Bay Area playwrights John Levine, Patrick Atkinson and Robyn Brooks.

A note from the New Works Committee: "Ten months ago when *Pet Lingerie* rose to the top of 70 local new plays long and short, we were drawn to its originality and audacity. After all, who can remember their passwords or resist the siren call of their smartphone? Plus, a play with a rabbi that wants to be a playwright and a Pope puppet that is the moral center of the show? Now in 2025, the biggest political stage suddenly features broligarchs, fact-checking has for once and all been discarded by Facebook, and AI is slipping its leash. Seems like the moment for a subversive little satire like *Pet Lingerie* to question this 'Digital Age.'"
